ORDINANCE 123560

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Opportunity Fund category of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy; accepting the recommendations of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee; authorizing the acquisition of real property commonly known as 18th Ave. SW & SW Brandon St. (Puget Ridge Edible Park) and 19<sup>th</sup> and Madison Neighborhood Park; authorizing acceptance of the deeds for open space, park, and recreation purposes; amending the 2011 Adopted Budget and 2011-2016 Capital Improvement Program; and increasing appropriations in connection thereto; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 122749 authorized a proposition to be submitted to Seattle's voters that would levy for up to six years regular property taxes in excess of the limitation on levies in Chapter 84.55 RCW for the purposes of acquiring, developing, or restoring parks, recreation facilities, cultural facilities, green spaces, playfields, trails, community gardens, and shoreline areas; and

WHEREAS, the proposed 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy (2008 Parks Levy) was approved by Seattle voters on November 4, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the 2008 Parks Levy program includes an Opportunity Fund, making available up to \$15,000,000 to fund acquisition and development projects not identified for funding in the remainder of the 2008 Parks Levy program; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 122749 established a Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee (Oversight Committee), with responsibilities to include adopting evaluation criteria and recommending Opportunity Fund awards to the Superintendent, Mayor, and City Council; and

WHEREAS, the Oversight Committee recommended two funding cycles for the Opportunity Fund and has conducted an extensive public process regarding acquisition and development projects to be funded in the first funding cycle; and

WHEREAS, the Oversight Committee recommended the allocation of \$6,966,000 for the Opportunity Fund's first funding cycle, which includes \$993,000 for acquisition projects, and \$5,973,000 for development projects; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council express their gratitude to the members of the Oversight Committee for their generous donation of time and expertise in adopting evaluation criteria, soliciting candidate projects, evaluating projects, and making recommendations for funding awards; and



1 WHEREAS, certain new projects are not presently included in the 2011-2016 Capital  
2 Improvement Program; NOW THEREFORE,

3 **BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:**

4 Section 1. The development project awards recommended by the Parks and Green  
5 Spaces Levy Oversight Committee, as listed in Attachment 1, are adopted.

6 Section 2. The acquisitions recommended by the Parks and Green Spaces Levy  
7 Oversight Committee are adopted. The Superintendent of Parks and Recreation or the  
8 Superintendent's designee is authorized to acquire, for fair market value as determined by  
9 appraisal, real property commonly known as: (a) 18th Ave. SW & SW Brandon St. (Puget Ridge  
10 Edible Park), and (b) 19<sup>th</sup> and Madison Neighborhood Park.

11 The legal descriptions are as follows:

12 18th Ave. SW & SW Brandon St. (Puget Ridge Edible Park)

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15 *Lot 4, Block 7, Homecroft Addition to the City of Seattle, according to the plat thereof recorded*

1           Section 3. The Superintendent of Parks and Recreation or the Superintendent's designee  
2 is authorized to undertake such investigations and to execute such documents as deemed  
3 necessary or desirable to accomplish the acquisition of the properties described in Section 2  
4 above and to accept the deeds for the Properties by attaching to the deeds the Superintendent's  
5 written acceptance and recording them. The Properties shall be accepted for open space, park,  
6 and recreation purposes, and placed under the jurisdiction of the Seattle Department of Parks  
7 and Recreation.  
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10           Section 4. In order to pay for necessary capital costs and expenses incurred, or to be  
11 incurred, but for which insufficient appropriations were made, the appropriations for the  
12 following in the 2011 Adopted Budget are increased from the fund shown, as follows:



**Legislation Title:** AN ORDINANCE relating to the Opportunity Fund category of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy; accepting the recommendations of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee; authorizing the acquisition of real property commonly known as 18th Ave. SW & SW Brandon St. (Puget Ridge Edible Park) and 19<sup>th</sup> and Madison Neighborhood Park; authorizing acceptance of the deeds for open space, park, and recreation purposes; amending the 2011 Adopted Budget and 2011-2016 Capital Improvement Program; and increasing appropriations in connection thereto; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.

**Summary and background of the Legislation:**

This legislation accepts the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee's recommendations for the first funding cycle of the Opportunity Fund. It increases the Department of Parks and Recreation's 2011 budget appropriation by \$6,966,000 for 13 development projects and two property acquisitions. The development of these projects will also lead to increased operating costs for the Department beginning in 2012. These costs increase each year as more projects are complete, and the estimated ongoing annual impact to the Department's operating budget after all 13 projects are finished is \$130,000.

On November 4, 2008, Seattle voters approved a six-year property tax levy, which included a \$15,000,000 Opportunity Fund. The Opportunity Fund is a designated funding source for acquisition and development projects not identified for funding in the remainder of the 2008 Parks Levy program. The levy established the Oversight Committee to help guide the evaluation of projects and to recommend Opportunity Fund awards to the Superintendent, Mayor, and City Council.

The Oversight Committee recommended two funding cycles for the Opportunity Fund, one in 2011 and the second in 2012. After an extensive public process over the past year, the Oversight Committee recommends 13 development projects shown in Exhibit C and two acquisitions shown in Exhibits A and B.

The total funding required for the 13 development projects is \$5,973,000, and this legislation adds each project to the 2008 Parks Levy-Opportunity Fund Development program (K720041).

The total funding required for the two property acquisitions is \$993,000. This amount provides \$520,000 to purchase property in the West Seattle neighborhood at 18th Ave. SW & SW Brandon St. (Puget Ridge Edible Park- Exhibit A), and \$473,000 to purchase property in the



Central District-Capitol Hill neighborhood (19<sup>th</sup> & Madison Neighborhood Park-Exhibit B). This appropriation is included in the 2008 Parks Levy Acquisition Opportunity Fund (K720040) program. The two property acquisitions have willing sellers and are ready to move forward. This legislation authorizes the acquisition of the two properties and acceptance of the property deeds.

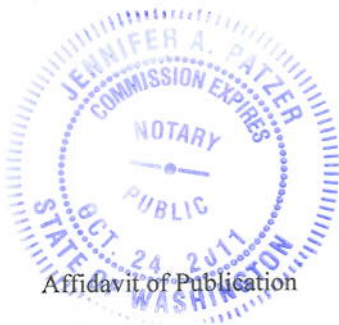

AN ORDINANCE relating to Seattle Public Utilities; authorizing the Director of Seattle Public Utilities to enter into long-term, full and partial requirements contracts and emergency intertie agreements with wholesale customers that have expiring water supply contracts with Seattle, and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 123560

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Opportunity Fund category of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy; accepting the recommendations of the 2008 Parks and Green Spaces Levy Oversight Committee; authorizing the acquisition of real property commonly known as 18th Ave. SW & SW Brandon St. (Puget Ridge Edible Park) and 19th and Madison Neighborhood Park; authorizing acceptance of the deeds for open space, park, and recreation purposes; amending the 2011 Adopted Budget and 2011 2016 Capital Improvement Program; and increasing appropriations in connection thereto; and ratifying and confirming certain prior acts, all by a three-fourths vote of the City Council.
