Wednesday, February 4, 2009

The Cass County Board of Supervisors met at 9:00 A.M. with all members present: Duane McFadden, Chair; David Dunfee, Chuck Kinen, Charles Rieken and Frank Waters. Agenda upon motion by Dunfee, 2nd by Waters was approved. Minutes of Jan 30, 2009 upon motion by Kinen, 2nd by Rieken were approved as read.

County Attorney Daniel Feistner reviewed current legal activity.

County Engineer Charles Marker reviewed current road projects. He reported that a 'new' road grader went off the roadway and was heavily damaged and the operator was injured.

MH/DD/GR Coordinator Teresa Kanning reviewed departmental activity.

Mike Kennon, recently hired as EMA coordinator, introduced himself and presented short report of EMA activity.

At 10:00 a.m. LaVon Eblen and Shirley Frederiksen representing Southwest Iowa Food and Farm Initiative (SWIFFI) and Golden Hills Resource Conservation and Development asked the board to consider creating a county food policy council. Contribution was also requested to help pay for a regional food coordinator (eight counties). Both items were taken under advisement.

[LaVon Eblen (with SWIFFI) stated that an Iowa Network Community Agriculture meeting was held four years ago. Food systems were discussed and local persons decided there was a need to look at a "food system". Aim to move local producers products to consumers. The local food group SWIFFI evolved.

Eblen explained that a food system includes everyone from the producer to consumer. Eblen stated that when officials began to work to bring the groups together, they initially thought there would be plenty of producers and that they would need to find consumers to use the producer's products. However the opposite existed: many consumers such as restaurants, food services and other institutions but insufficient producers.

SWIFFI member Keith Booth spoke about a program called the "New Farmer Jump Start" program that brought local producers and local consumers together, and about one successful program: local producers growing food that is sold directly to the Cass County Memorial Hospital (CCMH).

Shirley Frederiksen, Golden Hills Resource Conservation and Development Coordinator, said the Pottawattamie County Supervisors approved a resolution in August creating a regional local food coordinator position for five years. Another resolution created a local food council. They also approved \$35,000 in funding annually to pay the coordinator and other expenses for the food council. Members of the food councilwould not be paid a salary for serving. Frederiksen stated she believed \$30,000 was only about one half of what would be needed for the coordinator's salary. Applications for grants have been made and some funding has been received.

It is planned that the coordinator would work throughout the counties, which includes Cass, in the Golden Hills Resource Conservation and Development Region. Pottawattamie County requests that other counties consider the donation of \$5,000 each. Three thousand dollars would be used for the local food coordinator and \$2,000 would be used for expenses for the local Cass County food policy council. No formal written request was filed.]

Motion by Waters, 2nd by Dunfee: to establish a Cass County Local Food Council and to appropriate from the Local Option Sales Tax Fund \$500 towards its operation and to make a one year contribution of \$1,000 to help fund the regional local food coordinator position. Carried unanimously.

SWIMHC director (and full time clinician) John Bigelow presented a report on SWIMHC operations. In FY0708, about 745 Cass County and 500 out of county residents were served. They have more requests for service than can be handled. Some additional funding has been and will continue to be received from Medicaid. They are adding additional staff but hope additional revenues will be incurred and they will not need to increase the request for funding from the county.

County Auditor Dale Sunderman reviewed budgetary authority to expend considerations:

Motion by Rieken, 2nd by Kinen: to amend IDOT expenditure appropriations for FY2009: Decrease Secondary Roads construction 020 by \$2,658,000 (from \$3,505,000 to \$847,000); increase 710 Bridges and Culverts by \$75,000; increase 712 Snow and ice control by \$115,000; increase 713 Traffic controls by \$20,000; increase 720 New Equipment by \$243,000; increase 721 Equipment Operations by \$100,000. Carried unanimously. See copy of IDOT budget on page following these minutes)

Motion by Waters, 2nd by Dunfee: to make the following county budget appropriation adjustments (changes in spending authority) for FY2009: Increase Nonprogram Services by \$400,000 (flow thru of revenues for grants, etc); Increase Debt Service by \$50,000; Secondary Roads: decrease Construction by \$2,658,000, increase Roadway Maintenance by \$210,000, and increase General Roadway by \$343,000. Carried unanimously.

County Attorney Daniel Feistner reviewed current legal activity.

Dan McIntosh, SIRWA, met with the board to make the county aware of a proposed project. He reported that federal monies may be available to fund the installation of a rural water system in SW Cass Co. which has some 400 potential customers. About 200 miles of waterline would need to be run. For the project to be feasible, about 70% of those eligible would need to sign up. However, SIRWA would proceed if 50% indicated interest. SIRWA plans to mail a letter to all eligible potential customers.

He also recommended the CodeRED Emergency Notification System, a high volume-high speed communication service that delivers pre-recorded emergency messages directly to homes and businesses. This is a notification system SIRWA is currently using (about \$7,500).

MH/DD/GR Coordinator Teresa Kanning reviewed departmental activity.

Steve Olsen, reviewed a letter with recommendations from the Cass Co. Cultivators for persons who had been contacted and indicate interest in serving on the local Food Policy Council established 4/15/09. Also included were recommendations for statement of purpose and organization. The board discussed appointing the council and allowing the council to formulate policy and organization.

Motion by Dunfee, 2nd by Rieken: to appoint 9 persons to the Cass Co. Food Policy Council: Jerry Putnam, Brent Magee, Pat Markham, Emily Krengel, Jan Steffen, Dana Kunze, Lynn Larson, Jo Ann Poeppe and Dale Haupert. Term to be 4 calendar years: initially, 4 to serve through 2010 and 5 to serve through 2012. Organizational meeting to be held as soon as feasible. Carried unanimously.
